	Junior Women will be combined for seeding purposes and will compete as a single Open					
	competition. The categories will be separated into Open and Junior for results and					
	•	nada Points List (CPL) for both distance and sprint competitions

There will be no seeding for categories that do not require a racing license (e.g., Bantam and younger). Order of start will be by random draw.







REFUNDS:	A refund of individual registration fees will only be provided for medical reasons and if the competition secretary receives notification, WITH medical documentation, prior to the registration deadline of January 16, 2017 .				
SPRINTS:	Senior Men and Junior Men categories and the Senior Women and Junior Women categories will be combined in the Qualification race for seeding purposes and run as a single open class but will be separated into junior and senior for heats and awards. The top 30 Junior M/W and Senior M/W will advance to quarterfinal heats. Unless the Competition Secretary receives notice of an athlete's intent at the start of the Team Captains' Meeting on Thursday, January 19, 2017, all qualifying Junior M/W will be entered into the Junior quarterfinal heats. No changes will be allowed on race day.				
	Juvenile, Junior and Midget B/G will advance to heats depending on numbers entered.				
	As per the 2016/17 Technical Package, sprint heats will be timed and ICR rule 325.4.2.7 will apply. Lucky loser advancement will be based on best 3 rd and 4 th place time.				
	The "yellow card" written reprimand rule will be in effect for false starts, as per ICR 325.4.2.9.				
INTERVAL CLASSIC:	As per the FIS rule 343.8.1 poles must be no more than 83% of the racer's height in ski boots. This measurement is from the pole strap insertion to the tip of the pole.				
RELAY:	Each relay team is comprised of 3 skiers from the same Division				
	Relay Rules: Points will be awarded by Division down to top 5 per division. Unofficial teams are allowed to race but will not be counted for aggregate points purposes. Prizes will be awarded as follows - cash prize and merchandise for top three teams in open, medals for top three teams in all others.

BIB PICK-UP:	Bibs for each day of racing will be distributed from the Race Office.				
	Bib pick up will be by Club or Team – please specify your preference upon registration				
TEAM CAPTAIN MEETINGS	Meetings will be held the night before each race day, on Thursday through Saturday, at 7pm in the Whistler Athletes Centre at Function Junction.				
AWARDS:	Haywood NorAm Westerns Awards: INDIVIDUAL Cash Prizes will be given to the top five finishers in the Open Class plus the top U23 finisher for Day 1 and Day 2. Awards will also be presented to the top 3 Junior Men and Women. Awards will be presented to the top 3 by YoB for Midget thru Junior Boy/Girl races <u>RELAY</u> Top 3 Official Relay Teams in Open Class will receive cash prizing (1st:\$600, 2nd:\$450, 3rd:\$300). Top three official teams in all other categories will receive awards. Only skiers with FIS licenses are eligible for cash prizes.				
	TECK Coast Cup Awards: (based on TECK Technical Package)				
	*** A schedule of daily awards presentations will be posted at the Race Office***				
WESTERN CANADIAN POINTS:	Official NorAm race categories, midget through open senior, are eligible for the Championship rankings. Western Canada Championship SWIX/Fischer Cup will be given to Divisions only (not individuals). The Division aggregate will be based on the top 3 racers per Division in each individual category and top 5 racers per Division in the relay category. The NorAm points system is used for scoring. Points will be awarded for all races. Skier affiliation will be with their host club.				
COAST CUP POINTS:	Competitors in the Teck Coast Cup Races can earn points towards the aggregate awards for the overall Teck Coast Cup Series. This includes Juvenile 1 and Midget NorAm categories.				
PROTEST PROCEDURE:	Protest forms will be available in the Race Office. Protests must be made in writing, submitted to the Competition Secretary within 15 minutes of posting of unofficial results and accompanied by a \$50 CAD fee				
CONCESSION:	There is a full service café at the WOP Day Lodge.				
FACILITIES:	The Flex Space at the race site will be available to athletes as shelter. There are showers in the daylodge. There are toilets there as well but several portable toilets will also be located close to the stadium area.				
TRAIL FEES:	Trail fees are included in race fees for athletes and eligible coaches for the official training day, January 19, and all race days. Passes for all four days of skiing will be handed out at the WOP entry gate throughout the training day (Jan 19). Trail passes are REQUIRED to enter the gate each day. Trail fees and venue admission are not included for January 18, and required in order				







to ski. Each athlete and eligible coach requires a trail pass. If you forget or lose your pass you will be required to purchase a new one at regular price. If you do not get your trail passes on the training day, please arrive early on race day. There will be a dedicated lane for those who have their trail passes to facilitate ingress on race days but recommendations are to arrive early to allow for access and parking.

Park admission and trail fees apply to attendees not registered for the race. Regular trail pass rates (incl. GST) are as follows: Adult (19+) \$25.75; Youth (6-18) \$15.00. A link to Whistler Olympic Park. http://www.whistlersportlegacies.com/activities/cross-country-skiing

Athletes registered only in the Teck Coast Cup #2 and/or #3 in the Bantam, Atom and Pee-Wee categories will collect their trail pass at the gate on race day. Please leave sufficient time to enter the gate.

WAX FACILITIES: Eligible teams will be assigned wax trailer space according to the NorAm Technical package. For larger teams, it may be advisable to bring a generator as outlets are limited within the wax trailers.

Wax trailers will be available from Wednesday Jan 18 to Sunday Jan 22. Allocation will be based on number of athletes registered by division, according to the NorAm Technical Package. A key deposit of \$40 is required for each cabin. Wax cabins will contain 2 chairs, table, garbage cans and broom. Users are responsible for maintaining their space during the event. Extra garbage bags, repair needs etc can be requested from athlete services through the race office. Depending on registration, some teams may be located a short distance from the cross country stadium, at the biathlon venue. Any teams or clubs wishing to rent additional wax cabins may do so at a rate of \$40 per day, on a first come, first serve basis.

WAX TESTING: A wax testing/warm up area will be provided near the cross-country stadium. Wax testing on course is allowed at the discretion of the jury.

GLIDE WAXCross Country BC respectfully requests all coaches, wax technicians and parents abide by a
self-governed protocol while waxing skis for athletes racing in the *Midget age and younger*
categories. This request applies to all local, regional and provincial events taking place in
British Columbia (e.g. club races, loppets, regional cup races, BC Cup races, BC Championships,
BC Midget Championships and the BC Winter Games). This request also applies to athletes
traveling to BC from out-of-province or out-of-country.

The recommended glide waxing protocol is as follows:

- Non-Fluoro (NF) or Low Fluoro (LF) glide waxes ARE permitted
- Medium Fluoro (MF) or High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are NOT permitted
- Pure Fluoro glide waxes (powders, pucks, blocks and liquid) are NOT permitted
- · Cold weather powder additives and hardeners are NOT permitted

The adherence to this protocol is self-governed and is the responsibility of the coaches, parents and wax technicians.
